

## Getting connected at St. Luke

St. Luke Community Hospital has added another convenience feature for patients and visitors. The Ronan hospital now has Hi-Speed Wireless Internet so that those who want to stay connected to the World Wide Web while visiting the facility can do so without having to plug into a telephone wall jack.

The Wi-Fi is available from the surgery waiting area through the cafeteria to the hospital waiting rooms and patient rooms.

After logging on, users will be asked for an e-mail address acknowledging their acceptance of user responsibility. “The connection is independent of the St. Luke Internet and the users’ e-mail address will not be stored in any data base for reference,” according to Jim Schoenen, head of the Information Technology (IT) department at the Ronan hospital.

Those wanting to use the Wi-Fi service should be experienced in using Hi-Speed Wireless Internet as St. Luke will not be able to provide tech support for the service. A detailed fact sheet explaining the new visitor and patient benefit will be available at the admissions desk or in the in-patient information packet that those checking into the hospital receive.
